Fiscal Year 2021

THE NUMBERS

Futures provided residential supports to 16 people in agency-owned group home settings, 18 people in their own settings (apartment or home) and one person living with their family.

In FY 2021, Futures provided support to 40 people through our day supports program. **Twenty-six** of these individuals primarily participated in agencyprovided work activity during the course of the year. However, this type of day activity was impacted due to COVID-related closures. Fourteen people received employment-related support; of this number, seven held competitive employment. All individuals retained their employment during the course of COVID, although many had their hours cut or were unable to work due to their employer's COVID policies. **Fourteen** people primarily participated in a non-work activity, including recreation, volunteerism and health-related supports. Futures also served 12 people through Wellness Monitoring.

Targeted case management served 83 individuals during FY 2021. The Sumner County Community Developmental Disability Organization (CDDO) reported **39** people on the waiting list during this time period.


At the end of the fiscal year, Futures employed 53 full- and 32 part-time employees. More than \$3.5 million was paid in employee wages, taxes, and fringe benefits.



In a year of responding to changing community needs, those participating in preschool included 53 (PIR) Head Start, 18 Special Education, and 12 Pre-K children. In Early Head Start 33 (PIR) infants and toddlers were served, and 2 (PIR) prenatal mothers.

Developmental screenings were impacted by the CDC's COVID restrictions and were not conducted from July through December of 2021. When they resumed in January 2021, **seven** children who were 5 years old or younger were screened. Of those, **five** were referred for more thorough evaluations.

As the county's only provider of general public transportation, WALT (Wellington Area Local Transit) provided 15,068 rides in FY 2021, utilizing as many as four buses and **one** minivan to provide services.
